Vegetation Types

- Foredunes: spinifex - marram - (pingao): grassland, with occasional sand convolvulus
- Hind-dunes: marram: grassland, with occasional pampas, sand coprosma, tauhinu, boxthorn.
- Dune Flats: (a) Leptocarpus - (club sedge): reedland, with occasional cabbage tree, toetoe, pampas.
 (b) pasture of exotic grasses and clovers.
 (c) (cabbage tree)/manuka - Leptocarpus: shrub reedland.
 (d) *Schoenus nitens* - halfstar: herbfield, with *Chenopodium glaucum*, hyssop loosestrife, NZ lobelia, sea aster.

Salt Marsh (beside Whangaehu River): Zones variously dominated by the sedges three-square or kapungawha

Nationally threatened and uncommon species (de Lange *et al.* 1999)

Vulnerable: Dwarf mazus (*Mazus novaezeelandiae* subsp. *impolitus*)
 Vulnerable: Dune half star (*Selliera rotundifolia*) [see Heenan 1997]
 Recovering – conservation dependent: Pingao (*Desmoschoenus spiralis*)
